“The Impact of Gangs in Corrections” presented by Jim Aspiotis.

Jim Aspiotis is the Manager of the Ontario Corrections Intelligence Unit. He has worked in the corrections field in Ontario for the past 16 years and has held varying positions of responsibility including Correctional Officer, Operational Manager, Security Manager, Inspector, Project Officer and Deputy Superintendent. In those positions he has demonstrated significant knowledge in corrections management, law enforcement and gang management. Jim’s experience and commitment has also been recognized by being named the first corrections member to sit as an executive member of the Ontario Gang Investigators Association.

“The Sex Trade and Human Trafficking in Canada” presented by Natasha Falle and Wendy Babcock.

Natasha Falle has a passion for sharing her story of child exploitation, and dramatic conversion and liberation from 12 years working in the sex trade. She now lectures all over Canada on issues related to the sex trade. Many of her presentations are made to police and other law enforcers. She works directly with Toronto’s Sex Crimes Unit – Special Victims, offering detectives support with child victims of prostitution. She also provides victim court support, training workshops, and public speaking engagements.

Wendy Babcock is currently the chair of the Bad Date Coalition of Toronto, a group that produces a monthly “Bad Date Book” which publishes reports of violent acts committed against sex workers, including details of the attacker. She co-initiated a partnership with the Toronto Police Service to ensure sex workers can report assault without fear of persecution or prosecution, and is a member of the advisory group to the Special Victims Unit.
